Now that you are signed up to Expedition UK, we need your details to ensure that we can prepare for your arrival and accommodate your needs.

You will have a lot to organise as you get ready for your Expedition, but once you have made your preparations we require you to submit your personal and travel information through our Pre-departure Form.

To take part in Expedition and ensure the teams are ready for your arrival we require you to submit a series of personal/travel information.

# Arrival and departure

#### Meeting the team

You will be met in at Brixham Harbour by members of the Ocean Youth Trust & Raleigh Team. It's a small harbour, and they will be wearing Raleigh T-shirts, so you won't be able to miss them.

You will need to arrange your own transport to/from the arrival/departure points.

Please submit your full travel details via the Pre- Departure form.

It is essential that we receive your travel details, so we know when to expect you. If there are any changes to your travel, you must inform us as soon as possible.

# **Getting to Brixham harbour**

#### By rail:

Take the train to Paignton railway station, where you can get a bus from the station opposite or taxi from the rank outside. The bus terminal is in the middle of Brixham and a 10 minute walk or taxi to the harbour. Plan your journey via the National Rail Enquiries site.

#### By bus:

Several Megabus services travel to Exeter and Plymouth. From these hubs you can catch a train to Paignton, then onto Brixham.

#### By air:

The closest airport is Bristol Airport.

#### **Getting from Forest and Beach Centre**

#### By rail:

The nearest railway station is Totnes, where you can catch a train to sevral major hubs. Adventurers can be dropped there on request.



#### **Travel insurance**

If you are a British Citizen you will be covered by the NHS for any medical emergencies.

Due to the nature of the activities you will be getting involved in, we recommend that participants take out their own travel insurance for circumstances as below. OYT maintains appropriate insurance for activities provided under connection with the voyage.

- Loss or damage to personal possessions: OYT South's insurance will not cover items such as your phone or camera, or any lost money.
- Your travel to and from the boat (including travel if you had to leave a voyage early, whether due to illness or injury; personal choice; or being sent home by the skipper).
- Medical costs or expenses occurring during the voyage, or repatriation.
- Voyage cancellation or curtailment where OYT South and Raleigh is not liable to refund voyage fees (see <u>Terms and Conditions</u> paragraph 8).

You should ensure that any travel insurance includes appropriate cover for sailing trips, cancellation or curtailment, repatriation, personal effects, money and medical costs or expenses. It may be the case that your household contents policy covers your possessions while sailing with us

If you are from outside of the UK we recommend you get medical insurance in addition to the above insurance

# Day 1: Sat 20th July

Arrive at Brixham Harbour by 14:00 where the Ocean Youth Trust Team and a Raleigh member of Staff will greet you.

You'll find your bunk and somewhere to stow your gear, and you'll meet the other crew members.

Next comes the skipper's introductory chat. This is designed to make you feel at home on board Prolific and to tell you the basics of life on board.

You'll be divided into teams, or watches, with one of the staff as your watchleader. You'll be shown around the boat below deck and receive a safety briefing, and also given your essential gear

We will get to know each other with some classic Raleigh ice-breakers! We'll all get together to talk about where we want to go, given the weather, the tide and the strength of the crew. We might go further along the English coast, or perhaps we'll be able to sail to France or the Channel Islands.



# Day 2-6: Sun 21st - Thurs 25th July

When you're ready to sail, one watch will take charge of the boat and the others will be off duty for a few hours. The watch on deck will be steering, adjusting sails, keeping lookout, and helping with navigation. The crew might keep sailing through the night, which can be an amazing experience under clear starry skies, with each watch taking their turn while the others sleep.

When you visit a harbour during the voyage, we'll aim to give everyone chance to go ashore, look around or buy souvenirs.

## Day 7 - Fri 26th July

Following your adventure sail you will be confident playing your part in the team, helping to sail the boat.

Once anchored ashore you will have completed your sail and begin Changeover, which will take place the Forest and Beach nature residential based in the beautiful South Hams, Devon.

You will be picked up from the harbour on a bus, your Raleigh leader will be with you and there will be an additional Raleigh leader to meet you. Once you arrive at fieldbase, you will have time to relax set up camp and reflect on your incredible voyage on the Prolific.

You will have time to set up and allocate tents tents for the night, and to do other admin, such as washing any clothes and preparing for the days ahead.

There will be celebrations for successfully completing Phase One!

In the evening, we will take a walk to Beesands beach for our evening meal. There will be time for beach exploration, paddling (if weather permits) and time to explore the beach!





# Phase 2: Environmental project tackling plastic pollution

## Day 8 - Sat 27th July

In the morning and afternoon you will start your Coast Cleaning Adventure. You do an adventurous walk / scramble around a section of South Devon coast where it is likely we will encounter significant amounts of plastic pollution.

You will spend the day on the coast immersed in nature recovering what you can to help keep it free of hazards for wildlife - we will stop for lunch and potentially a wild swim!

In the late afternoon we will travel back to Fieldbase have time to chill and do some fun activities.

After dinner, there will be an evening activity in the woods with the Archery and Forest School.

#### Day 9 - Sun 28th July

In the morning and afternoon you will do Seashore and Coastal Foraging. This is a really empowering experience delivered by an expert, focused on seaweeds and easily identifiable hedgerow greens, with lements of bushcraft and opportunities to try cooked and prepared foraged foods in a spectacular coastal environment. From 3pm onwards you will return to to Fieldbase for downtime and activities.



Day 10 - Mon 29th July

In the morning and afternoon you will do a Cicular Kayaking Adventure. Using Till the Coast is Clear's double kayaks made from recycled fishing nets and post consumer waste, the team will paddle down a beautiful estuary learning about the local ecology, before completing the journey with a hike back.

There will be lunch/snack stops and good opportunities for discussion about circular thinking and practices including a shoreline clean up. After you return to Fieldbase for your final evening.

# Day 10 - Mon 29th July - Continued

As the last night of your Expedition it will be a night of celebration and reflection.

We will enjoy an evening together reflecting on all your Expedition achievements. We will have a celebration award ceremony followed by a final walk and paddle on the beach.

# Day 11 - Tues 30th July

You will have a final breakfast with your teammates.

You will either be picked up from Fieldbase or if you require we can help arrange to take you to the nearest station (Totnes).

# **Expedition Phone Policy**

We encourage all our volunteers to embrance the unplug culture whilst on Expedition.

We will ask all volunteers to place their phones in a safe with the project coordinator for the duration of each phase. All volunteers will have the opportunity to get their phone back to get in touch with loved ones during changeover.

The Raleigh team will share photos of the Expedition on social media, so family & friends should follow Raleigh's social media channels to catch any possible updates. However, due to remote nature of projects we don't always have access to photos, so a stream of updates should not be expected.

#### Discrimination on any grounds

If you see, hear or encounter any discrimination of any kind, do not challenge that person or intervene. If you feel that you need to express your views, please tell your Project Coordinator and they will take the necessary actions. Raleigh International is strongly against any form of discrimination and any information given to us is taken very seriously.
